## PROPOSITION I

On May 11, 2013 Lakeside voters will have an opportunity to vote for or against a proposition adopting three additional sales taxes to be collected by the City. Revenue is collected from everyone who shops in Lakeside, unlike property taxes that are collected only from property owners in the City. The first tax in the proposition is a 1/2 cent 4B Economic Development Tax that will generate revenue to fund economic development activities. The 4B tax provides cities with a wider range of uses for the tax revenues because it is intended to give communities an opportunity to undertake a project for quality of life improvements, including economic development that will attract and retain primary employers.

The second tax is a 0.25 percent sales tax dedicated for street resurfacing and rehabilitation in the City limits. This 0.25 percent sales tax, also called the quarter-cent sales tax has a four-year sunset clause unless it is reauthorized, according to state law. Once in effect, the quarter-cent sales tax provides a funding source for street maintenance in Lakeside. Funds can be used only for curb-to-curb street maintenance, not sidewalks or trails.

The third sales tax is a 1/4 cent sales tax to be used for property tax relief. In this tax the sales tax collected by the City goes to directly reduce the ad valorem or property tax rate collected by the City from its residents.

### MESSAGE FROM MAYOR PAT JACOB

Soon we will be starting into our annual water conservation program. Your support of this program really contributes to the overall quality of life everyone enjoys in our town. It helps in keeping our water systems maintenance by level loading the systems operations. We now have the core of the entire system automated for control and monitoring the operation. In the past it required a constant monitoring to find failures. Now the equipment can report places that are not operating as they should. This in turn allows our water department to correct the problems before they become failures.

The installation of the natural gas pipeline connecting the pad site off Western Trails is still ongoing. Most of the pipeline is being bored underground thru the Fort Worth portion. Most of the work is being done off Silver Creek Road and the ONCOR power line easement at Silver Creek and Watercross intersection.
