A NOTE FROM THE MAYOR

Burning within Lakeside: Several citizens have asked about burning small items such as leaves, cut brush or storm damage – tree branches etc. Generally, burning is not allowed in Tarrant County. We live in a **Non-Attainment** area. Our air quality does not meet EPA targets. This does not include your fireplace or backyard fire pit. It does pertain to open air burning. There are 2 exceptions, 1) TCEQ burn permit or 2) Municipal burning ordinance – Lakeside does not have an ordinance - not requested by citizens.

Well Owners within Lakeside: Private well owners in the town should be familiar with our Groundwater District's plan. This plan has been approved by the Texas Water Development Board and has been adopted by the GW District. This plan affects everyone in Lakeside, especially if you own a well as you are responsible for compliance with district regulations.

CodeRED is a high-speed emergency notification system that was implemented by the Town of Lakeside in 2013. This system is used by City personnel to send phone calls, text messages, emails and social media in an effort to effectively inform residents to protect life and property. The Town of Lakeside also uses this system to inform residence that the water is going to be shut off. When the water department is working on projects around town the water can sometimes be turned off for hours at a time. Keeping Away Mosquitoes



Apply repellents when heading outside. Mosquitos may bite at any time of day or night.

Wear repellents approved by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). They have been approved after being tested for negative effects.

Active ingredients for repellents may include DEET, picaridin, IR3535 or oil of lemon-eucalyptus (para-methane diol).

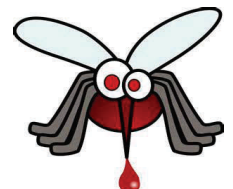
Read the label before applying any repellent.

Do not apply repellents to eyes, nose, mouth, irritated skin, wounds or cuts.

Permethrin may be applied to clothing, bed nets or other supplies. Do not apply it directly on skin.






Homeowner Anti-mosquitoes Checklist

- Unclog gutters
- Drain flowerpot dishes
- Apply Bti/methoprene (pesticide) to yard drains
- Dump plastic wading pools
- Dispose of unused tires or drill holes in them
- Turn wheelbarrows upside down
- Dump containers in yards
- Fill tree holes with sand or cement
- Check for leaky faucets and/or pipes
- Replace water in bird baths and animal dishes daily
- mosquito eating fish in ponds
- Check screens on windows and door for tears
- Keep vegetation trimmed to prevent
