## A Note From The Mayor

On May 17<sup>th</sup>, there was an article in the Star Telegram regarding future water planning for North Texas.

This effort is led by the Texas Water Development Board and involves both ground and surface water. Our Groundwater Management Area (GMA) is part of that planning effort. Within the GMA is our Groundwater Conservation District. A new set of proposed Desired Future Conditions (DFC) for the area aquifers are being proposed by the District and GMA 8 under §36.108, Texas Water Code. This will impact all groundwater users as rules will be adopted to insure that these conditions are met.

**Public Comments and Hearing:** The Northern Trinity Groundwater Conservation District will hold a public hearing on the proposed desired future conditions at a time and location to be determined in the future. Dates, times, and places for the public hearing will be posted on the District website, at the District's office, county clerk's web site, and in the local newspaper. Public comments will be accepted by the District through July 12, 2016.

**How does this affect me?** Almost everyone in our area uses groundwater. Lakeside's public water system uses groundwater. Fees assessed by the GCD are part of our production costs. As such, this affects all of us.

## Annual Water Conservation Plan Began Sunday, May 1st

The Town's annual water conservation plan began Sunday, May 1st and ends Saturday, October 1st. You may only water two days each week. This reduces the daily stress on the water production system by almost 40%. The plan is outlined as follows:

-  No property may use water for watering and landscaping purposes at any time on Mondays.
-  No watering is allowed between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day.
-  Hand watering of plants and flowers, not to include grass, is allowed any day during the permitted hours.
-  You have two days each week you can water your lawn, before 10 a.m. or after 6 p.m. The schedule is to follow, and is divided according to the last number of your address.

# Bulk Trash Pickup on July 20th

## Large Item Pickup

Large items may be placed at the curb beginning the Saturday before the large item pickup scheduled for Wednesday. On the large item pickup day, the large items must be out no later than 7 A.M. The items cannot exceed twenty (20) cubic yards in total volume or have any individual item exceeding fifty (50) pounds in weight. These items may include, but shall not be limited to, stoves, refrigerators and HVAC's (with verification that CFC components have been removed by a certified technician), water tanks, water heaters, washing machines, furniture, and similar waste materials. Items that will not be picked up are construction or demolition waste, hazardous waste, tires, dead animals or stable matter.



## Trash

Pickup days are Tuesdays & Fridays.

Garbage & Recycling must be at the curb no later than 7:00 A.M. Recycling is picked up on Friday by a separate truck.

\*Limit of 6 additional trash bags at curb for pick up each trash day.

Each resident will provide and use containers for trash that securely close in such a manner to prevent the scattering of the contents thereof and to render said containers inaccessible to insects, rodents and other animals. Cans and bags must weight no more than 50 lbs. and be no larger than 30 gallons in size. Items must be placed within six feet of the curb.





Recycling Containers are available at Town Hall.

## Brush Pickup

Brush will be picked up at the curb on your normal pickup day if it is cut into four-foot lengths and bundled. Bundles should not exceed 50 pounds in weight.
