Annual Water Conservation Plan Begins Wednesday, May 1st

The Town's annual water conservation plan begins Wednesday, May 1st and ends Tuesday, October 1st. The days you may water are two each week, which is the schedule the plan ended up on last year. This reduces the daily stress on the water production system by almost 40%. The plan is outlined as follows:



- No property may use water for watering and landscaping purposes at any time on Mondays.
- No watering is allowed between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day.
- Hand watering of plants and flowers, not to include grass, is allowed any day during the permitted hours.
- You have two days each week you can water your lawn, before 10 a.m. or after 6 p.m. The schedule is to follow, and is divided according to the last number of your address:

MESSAGE FROM MAYOR PATRICK JACOB

We are coming into the West Nile time of year. Tarrant County is working to get ahead of the mosquitoes this year. Mosquito traps have been issued by the County to capture larva so that they can be tested for the virus. If infected larva are found, then steps can be taken to eliminate the mosquitoes in that area. The Town's website has the 6 step CDC recommended plan that the County is following.

The County health officials have found it takes about 2 weeks for an infected mosquito larva to become an adult. If a person with a compromised immune system is bitten, it takes an average of 19 days to report symptoms to healthcare providers. The best action we can personally take is to use mosquito repellents when outside and keep any potential breeding sites drained.

The natural gas pipeline boring is complete. The pipeline company bored a pilot hole from each end, Weaver pad site to Silver Creek and they met in the middle. Next step is to enlarge the hole by over boring the pilot hole, and then they will begin pulling the pipeline thru. Sections will be welded together as the "pull" progresses. WEST NILE VIRUS

Nationwide, 2012 represented the greatest number of human cases of West Nile Virus since 2003 with a third of all cases reported from Texas. The North Texas region accounted for approximately 92% of all cases in Texas. Consequently, Tarrant County has taken steps to expand and modify its West Nile Virus surveillance and response program. They are increasing the emphasis on mosquito surveillance earlier this year, and expanding and remodeling the surveillance trapping system and developed a phased response to mosquito surveillance.

In an agreement between the Town of Lakeside and the County, Tarrant County will provide traps and laboratory testing for the mosquito samples, while the city operates the traps and submits samples for testing. The County has provided Lakeside with three traps that the Water Department will place around the town every other Wednesday and taken up the following morning. One trap will be placed at the sewer plant, one at the compound and the third will be placed in a different location each time.
