City of Fort Worth V. Town of Lakeside Update:

Fort Worth and Lakeside are actively negotiating a mutually agreeable resolution of the pending lawsuit. It is anticipated that the settlement will result in substantially all of the property recently annexed by Lakeside remaining in Lakeside. The terms will also likely include the conveyance and exchange of CCN. The final settlement will require the approval of both City Councils.

FY 2016-2017 Budget

The Town of Lakeside has conducted public hearings on the proposed tax rate of 0.360192 per \$100 of value and approved the proposed Budget for the Fiscal Year October 1, 2016 through September 30, 2017. The approved tax rate will increase total taxes in the Town of Lakeside by \$57,911 (3.06%) due to an increase in property values.

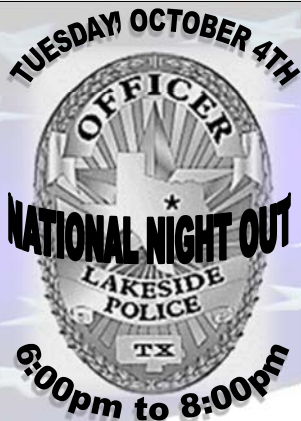

Have emergency contact information attached to costumes.

Be cautious of strangers and animals.



Do not go into a strangers' home.
