Texas 199 Changes

Texas Department of Transportation will be installing new signs on Texas 199. These new signs will indicate the exits and show the new Town Limits for Lakeside. The first signs to be installed will be on the southeast side of the road. The Northwest side will get new signs when the work is completed at Nine Mile Bridge. New "No Turn on Red" signs will be installed at Surfside.

More on Texas 199

The current construction on 199 is on schedule, even though we have experienced plenty of rain this summer. The next phase of construction from Nine Mile Bridge to Lake Worth is currently being planned. Also, we have been seeing Geotech work being done for the section in Lake worth. The borings will allow the engineers to determine what type of construction techniques will be required for the new road and overpasses.

Take Care of Texas Offers Tips to Conserve Water



1. **Replace Your Toilet**— If you have an old toilet, a newer, more efficient one can save 13,000 gallons of water per year. That's about \$110 in savings per household.



2. **Trade Up to an ENERGY STAR Clothes Washer**— A full-sized ENERGY STAR clothes washer saves 3,000 gallons of water per year. They also use about 25% less energy which could save you \$45 per year on your utility bill.



3. **Install Water-Efficient Shower Heads And Faucet Aerators**— A WaterSense - labeled showerhead uses about 2,900 gallons less water per year than a standard showerhead. Replacing old, inefficient faucets and aerators can save another 700 gallons of water per year.



4. **Use the Dishwasher Wisely**— Scrape Dirty dishes instead of rinsing them. Running a dishwasher with a full load on "light wash" saves more water than hand washing dishes. An ENERGY STAR dishwasher is about 30% more efficient than a standard model and saves about 3,870 gallons over it's lifetime.



5. **Fix Leaks**— A faucet leaking at a rate of one drop per second can waste up to 3,000 gallons of water per year.

FIGHT THE BITE! PROTECT yourself from the West Nile & Zika Virus with the 4 D's.



1. Stay indoors at **DUSK** and **DAWN**. This is the time of day that mosquitoes are most active.
2. **DRESS** in long sleeves/pants, loose and light-colored clothing when outdoors.
3. **DEFEND** yourself from mosquitoes by wearing insect repellent that contains DEET, Picaridin, or Oil of Lemon Eucalyptus.
4. **DRAIN** standing water in your yard and neighborhood. Also make sure that flowerpots, water dishes, bird baths and wading pools are properly drained so they are not breeding grounds for mosquitos.

Lakeside has been hit by Car Hoppers stealing from unlocked cars in the area.
Take steps to protect yourself from being a victim.

TIPS TO FOLLOW:

1. NEVER leave valuables in view, even if your car is locked. Any purses, bags, cell phones, computers, sports equipment and clothing should be taken inside with you. If you can't take it in, hide it or lock it in the trunk.
2. ALWAYS lock your car, put windows up and close the sunroof
3. NEVER leave your keys in the car.
4. Take out removeable radios and face plates.
5. When possible, park in well-lit areas.



Combat GPS thefts:

1. Remove the GPS unit and clip when you exit your vehicle.
2. If you must leave the unit in the car, be sure to hide both it and the clip or suction cup that holds it. Thieves see the clip and know there is a unit somewhere in the vehicle.
3. Frequently wipe your dash to remove tell-tale dust rings that are left by suction cup mounts. Replace the cover to the vehicle's power outlet when not in use.
4. Record the serial number and keep a copy in the glove compartment and with your other valuable papers at home to assist the police with recovery should your unit be stolen.

Call 911 if you see any persons committing suspicious activities such as:

- * Pulling on door handles of vehicles to see if they open
- * Checking for an alarm system by bumping or hitting a window or bumper of a vehicle.
- * Looking into car windows.
