# Silver Creek Bridge Project Update

Unfortunately, the Silver Creek project has encountered some new construction problems. The bridge reconstruction, is now forecast to be complete by early September. The reconstruction of Live Oak Creek Bridge has been postponed, maybe indefinitely. Everyone will be glad to have this key access to Loop 820 returned to us.

# <u>Planned Development Coming to Our Area</u>

A new housing development under consideration. Located west of Silver Creek Road and north of Verna Road, just off the intersection of Silver Creek and Verna Trail near Brewer High School. The development projected to have 527 homes and an Amenity Center. The City of Fort Worth held a pre-development conference in early May. Several areas along Silver Creek Road were rezoned in 2007 for residential development. This development will be in Fort Worth's council district 3.

#### Improvements to Lakeside's water system

Is still forecast to be complete shortly. The water tower is complete and will be filled when the line from the tower to the North is completed. From there, a line to 199 and down the service road remain to be completed. This completion of this loop will be the final phase of the current water system improvement project.
