CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING There will be a roll off

There will be a roll off

container at Town Hall located by the Pickle Ball courts for Christmas trees. Lakeside residents can drop off their Christmas trees between January 5th and January 13th. The trees will need to be clean (no lights, ornaments or tinsel) for them to go into the roll off container and they will be recycled. Or, you can put your tree at the curb. The trees at the curb will not be recycled and does not have to be clean.



MEALS ON WHEELS of Tarrant County delivered 854,557 meals to 4,156 homebound, elderly and disabled Tarrant County residents in FY 2018. Nutritious meals and daily safety checks provided by caring volunteers allow clients to remain living independently without the need for taxpayer-funded nursing care. In addition to meals, there is nutritional counseling, fall prevention, and medication reconciliation programs.

Meals are available to those who are homebound for any length of time, are physically or mentally unable to prepare nutritious meals for themselves and have no one to help them on a regular basis.

While the primary goal is always nutritional health and safety, we do not want to overlook the financial impact on the communities served by Meals On Wheels. The cost to provide home –delivered meals for one year is just \$1,690. This is roughly the same cost of one day in the hospital or six days in a nursing home. The math is simple; keeping people in their homes by providing nutritious meals saves billions of dollars in Medicaid spending each year.

This was a challenging year with lower than expected community funding. Meals On Wheels works hard to keep their overhead low so that they can provide services to everyone who needs their assistance. You will be glad to know that \$0.86 of every dollar donated goes directly to providing services for those in need. Meals On Wheels of Tarrant County asks for your help in supporting their Home-Delivered Meals program by including them in your budget. As the weather gets colder they are also in need of electric space heaters, blankets, gloves and hats and other items to keep their clients warm and cozy during the winter months. Safety Tips for the Holiday Season



- Keep poisonous plants out of reach of children and pets.
- Keep trees away from fireplaces, radiators and other heat sources.
- Install CO and smoke alarms in your home and be sure to test once a month.
- ♦ Make sure your tree has a sturdy platform.
- Check holiday lights for fraying, bare spots or excessive kinking in the wire.
- If using a natural tree, make sure it is well watered.
- ♦ Turn off tree lights and decorations when you are not home.
- When preparing a meal, wash hands, utensils, sink and anything else that touches raw meat.
