Notes from Mayor Patrick Jacob

Lake Worth ISD is working to begin a reading Mentoring program that partners 1st grade students who are reading a bit below grade level with adults in the community. LWISD will be using the Read 2 Win program that has been used successfully in Fort Worth ISD schools as well as other school districts in our area. LWISD is looking for adults to commit to one hour per week to work with two students for thirty minutes each week. During the session, the volunteer or adult reading coach will spend 8 minutes on spelling, 8 minutes on sight words and 14 minutes on reading and comprehension with each student. The Read 2 Win program outlines for the volunteer exactly what to do each week and involves a one-time training of 90 minutes prior to beginning the program.

LWISD is interested in working with anyone who loves children (and can pass a background check). Read 2 Win has partnered with the Police Department in Fort Worth to help provide positive mentors to students. LWISD would love to partner with any community agency to help all LWISD students read on grade level by the end of third grade. LWISD believes, along with the Read 2 Win program, that if we teach a child to read, we give them a chance.

CodeRED Rapid Emergency Notification

The Town of Lakeside has contracted with **CodeRED**; an Ormand Beach, Florida based Emergency Communications Network, to provide emergency notification services to the community. This critical feature allows city officials to send you important information regarding water main breaks, boil water notices, criminal activities, severe weather warnings, missing children and more. You can register using your phone number, e-mail, Gmail, Facebook or Twitter credentials. Go to www.lakesidetexas.us and click on the **CodeRED** link, you will then be routed to the **CodeRED** enrollment page to sign up.

Friendly Reminder;

We all want to keep our town clean. Each resident will provide and use containers for trash that securely close in such a manner to prevent the scattering of contents and be inaccessible to insects, rodents and other animals. Garbage must be at the curb no later than 7 AM, you may set your garbage out not more than 12 hours prior to the scheduled collection day and the empty containers removed from curbside or front area of the property not later than 7 AM on the morning following the regular collection day. Brush will be picked up at the curb on your normal pickup day if it is cut into four-foot lengths and bundled. Bundles should not exceed 50 pounds in weight. If the garbage or recycling has not been picked up on the scheduled pick-up day you will need to notify Town Hall immediately.
