What Is West Nile Virus?

West Nile virus is an infection that can cause a serious health disease. WNV is established as a seasonal epidemic in North America that flares up in the summer and continues into the fall.

What Can I Do to Prevent WNV?

The easiest and best way to avoid WNV is to prevent mosquito bites. When outdoors, use repellents containing DEET, picaridin, IR3535, some oil of lemon eucalyptus or paramenthane-diol. Follow the directions on the package. Many mosquitoes are most active from dusk to dawn. Be sure to use insect repellent and wear long sleeves and pants at these times or consider staying indoors during these hours. Make sure you have good screens on your windows and doors to keep mosquitoes out. Get rid of mosquito breeding sites by emptying standing water from flower pots, buckets and barrels. Change the water in pet dishes and replace the water in bird baths weekly. Drill holes in tire swings so water drains out. Keep children's wading pools empty and on their sides when they aren't being used.



Mosquito Test Positive for West Nile Virus In <u>Unincorporated Tarrant County.</u> No human cases reported; spraying to take place Friday night.

June 17, 2015 (Tarrant County, TX) – Tarrant County Public Health (TCPH) has confirmed a West Nile Virus (WNV) positive mosquito sample in unincorporated Tarrant County. No human cases have been reported in 2015.

The positive mosquito sample was collected in the area around <u>Yucca Flats Trail</u> in Northwest Tarrant County. July 2015

Silver Creek Bridge project has been delayed to the end of July. The project has been affect by the wet spring weather that we have been experiencing. The picture below was taken on June 17 when we had 4.5 inches of rain in Lakeside.



The wet weather is also disrupting the Town's water improvement project. The new water tank was scheduled to be on line by the end of June. That date has been rescheduled to the end of July. The weather has also slowed down the contractor installing the new water mains.

Please use caution on the area roads around Lake Worth. During and after Wednesday's rain Watercress Road experienced some deep runoff that was crossing the road. Smaller cars attempting to drive thru may experience problems. Rain is not soaking into the ground and is just running off as shown by the water level in the above picture.
