The survey's purpose is to see if Ella young qualifies for CBDG Block Grant funds for infrastructure improvement, major upgrade to the water system for your neighborhood.

Lawsuit Settled: Negotiations with Fort Worth have been completed *Lakeside kept all the land that was annexed in* 2015, except for the east side of 199. Some land swap also occurred. New maps are in the works, and when complete, they will be posted on the Town's website. Working copies are available to view at Town Hall.

Current and future Fort Worth residents will continue to be served by Lakeside water until Fort Worth can install their water lines. The time frames vary by area. Both cities are working together on the process.

Flashing Stop Signs at 199 & 1886

When it comes to crashes, right-angle collisions are among the most dangerous for vehicle occupants. Because these crashes often occur at stop-controlled intersections when drivers fail to stop, TXdot has put in some flashing LED stop signs—normal octagonal stop signs with flashing lights mounted on the outer edges—in an attempt to improve safety at this intersection.

The innovative LED technology has a set of synchronized high-intensity LEDs. These LED signs extend the range of visibility of the sign during day and night and for all weather conditions. Furthermore, the added benefit of flashing lights further increases driver awareness and safety for both pedestrians and drivers in the area. These features have a proven increase in visibility and safer driver behavior.

Driving is a full time job. You can reduce your chances of an accident if you adhere to the rules of the road and always drive defensively.

TO ENSURE A WORRY-FREE HOLIDAY, HERE ARE SOME SIMPLE THANKSGIVING SAFETY TIPS TO KEEP YOUR FAMILY AND HOME SAFE FOR THE HOLIDAYS

- Remove objects that might allow access to your home. For example, ladders for cleaning leaves out of gutters can be used
 to enter a window or scale a fence.
- Don't post Thanksgiving travel plans on Social Media letting people know that you will be out of town.
- Turn your telephone ringer down so no one outside can hear repeated rings; and review your answering machine message to make sure it does not imply that you are away.
- Make sure to have all mail, newspapers, and deliveries stopped or picked up by a neighbor, friend or relative.
- Never leave a key hidden outside. Burglars know all the best hiding places.
- Secure all windows, including those upstairs and reduce the chance of easy entry by cutting tree limbs away from secondstory windows.
- Have a friend move your car occasionally if it is parked in the driveway.
- Use timers to operate lights.
- Fill out a House Watch form and submit it to the Lakeside Police Department for extra patrol around your house. House
