TCPH COVID-19 FAQs

How can I help protect myself?

The best way to prevent infection is to avoid exposure. The U.S. State Department has issued a "Do Not Travel" advisory to China (Jan. 30, 2020). The CDC recommends everyday preventive actions to help prevent the spread of respiratory viruses, including:

- * Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60 percent alcohol if soap and water are not available.
- * Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- * Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- * Stay home when you are sick.
- * Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- * Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.
- * These are everyday habits that can help prevent the spread of several viruses.
- * Be current with vaccinations, including the influenza vaccine.

What should I do if I had close contact with someone who has 2019-nCoV but didn't have any symptoms?

If you have had close contact with someone who is confirmed to have, or is being evaluated for, 2019-nCoV infection, you should report this contact and yourself to TCPH for active monitoring immediately. Watch for these signs and symptoms:

- * Fever. Take your temperature twice a day.
- * Coughing.
- * Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing.
- * Other early symptoms to watch for are chills, body aches, sore throat, headache, diarrhea, nausea/vomiting, and runny nose.
- * **If you develop fever or any of these symptoms, call TCPH (817- 321-5350) right away or present to the emergency room.**
- * Under CDC guidance, health departments are now monitoring persons traveling from China. Those who have come from Hubei Province, China are more intensively monitored due to their perceived risk. People traveling from mainland China are perceived to be at medium risk and contacts of confirmed 2019-nCoV cases are perceived to be at high risk, and will be monitored in coordination with TCPH.

During the summer months, door-to-door salespeople may become more frequent in the neighborhoods across Tarrant County. Some salespeople may be legitimate, but others may use deceptive tactics to take advantage of trusting consumers. People who answer the door for a salesperson should protect themselves.

- * All salespeople must get an Itinerant Merchant Permit to go Door-to-Door in the Town of Lakeside.
- * Be Alert for Scams and Rip-offs.

Some door-to-door salespeople are selling real products and services, but quite a few are pushing scams. The most important thing to remember is that, when a person comes to your door selling something, you don't know who the person is or where to find them if the deal goes wrong.

If you buy from, or contract with, a reputable local business, you can always take the product back or dispute the work done. If you buy from a fly-by-night seller, chances are you will never see him or her again. Don't put yourself in this position.

Right to Cancel

Remember that Texans have the right to cancel a sale within three business days. Do not sign a contract with any blank spaces or that is undated, and always keep copies of anything signed or initialed.
