RESOLUTION NO. 2021-003

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF LAKESIDE, TEXAS CANCELING THE GENERAL ELECTION SCHEDULED FOR MAY 1st, 2021 AND DECLARING THE UNOPPOSED CANDIDATES FOR CITY COUNCIL MEMBERS FOR MAYOR AND SINGLE MEMBER DISTRICTS NUMBERS 2 and 4 TO OFFICE AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS a City Council General Election is scheduled for May 1st, 2021; and,

WHEREAS the City Secretary of the Town of Lakeside has certified in writing that the candidates for Mayor and Council Member Places 2 and 4 are unopposed and that no write-in candidates have filed to be placed on the list of write-in candidates; and,

WHEREAS Texas Election Code Sections 2.051 through 2.054 authorize the City Council to declare each unopposed candidate elected to office and to cancel the election;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF LAKESIDE, TARRANT COUNTY, TEXAS:

- 1. That <u>Patrick Jacob</u> is hereby declared the duly elected Mayor to serve a two-year term of office, to begin May 1, 2021.
- 2. That <u>Katherine Livingston</u> is hereby declared the duly elected City Council Member for Place 2 to serve a two-year term of office, to begin May 1, 2021.
- 3. That <u>Amy Robinson</u> is hereby declared the duly elected City Council Member for Place 4 to serve a two-year term of office, to begin May 1, 2021.
- 4. That after May 1, 2021, a certificate of election shall be issued to the above-named unopposed candidates in the same manner as provided for the candidates elected at the election.
- 5. That upon issuance of certificates of election, the above-named unopposed candidates shall be sworn into office in the same manner provided for the candidates elected at the election.
- 6. That this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

Water: The annual water use survey was completed and submitted to TWDB. Monthly Bacteriological samples came back clean. During the winter storm, the water system did just fine compared to multiple water systems in Texas. The only issue we had was the loss of power for 30+ hours at the upper pump station, but the back-up generator kicked in and provided constant power the station.

Wastewater: The monthly effluent samples were within permit limits. One of the pump and motors on the aeration pond went out and is currently being rebuilt. The wastewater plant lost power during the winter storm as well, but no major issues occurred.

Street Maintenance: 2 tons of asphalt was used to fill in some spaces around the new curbs that were poured last month. 5 pot hole/low spots in the town have been marked and cut out for repair.

Ella Young Project: Tejas Construction Co. was delayed because of the weather and was also performing emergency assist for the Fort Worth Water Dept. Tejas resumed construction on Ella Young on March 1st and started laying the new water main in the 8000 block of Ella Young.

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

COUNTY OF TARRANT

This Interlocal Agreement is between Tarrant County, Texas ("COUNTY"), and the Town of Lakeside ("TOWN").

WHEREAS, the TOWN is requesting the COUNTY's assistance with the manufacturing of roadway signs, including street name signs and regulatory signs, to be installed within the TOWN's public rights-of-way ("Project").

WHEREAS, the Interlocal Cooperation Act contained in Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code provides legal authority for the parties to enter into this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, during the performance of the governmental functions and the payment for the performance of those governmental functions under this Agreement, the parties will make the performance and payment from current revenues legally available to that party; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of the COUNTY and the TOWN Council of the TOWN each make the following findings:

- a. This Agreement serves the common interests of both parties;
- b. This Agreement will benefit the public;
- c. The division of costs fairly compensates both parties to this Agreement; and
- d. The TOWN and the COUNTY have authorized their representative to sign this Agreement; and
- e. The COUNTY and TOWN acknowledge that they are each a "governmental entity" and not a "business entity" as those terms are defined in Tex. Gov't Code § 2252.908, and therefore, no disclosure of interested parties pursuant to Tex. Gov't Code Section 2252.908 is required.

NOW, THEREFORE, the COUNTY and the TOWN agree as follows:

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. COUNTY RESPONSIBILITY

The COUNTY will furnish the labor, equipment and materials to complete the requested Project.

The COUNTY will manufacture the Project's signs in accordance with the requirements of the current version of the Texas Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (TMUTCD).

2. TOWN RESPONSIBILITY

The TOWN will pay the COUNTY the invoiced amount for the cost of materials and labor to complete the Project. The actual cost to the TOWN will be determined upon completion of the Project.

The TOWN will provide the COUNTY a detailed description of the signage requested.

The TOWN will retrieve, at its own expense, the completed signs from the COUNTY. Upon retrieval from the COUNTY, the TOWN will review the signs for accuracy and completeness.

3. PROCEDURES DURING PROJECT

If the TOWN has a complaint regarding the COUNTY's performance of the Project, the TOWN must complain in writing to the COUNTY no later than 30 days of the date of Project completion.

4. NO WAIVER OF IMMUNITY

This Agreement does not waive COUNTY rights under a legal theory of sovereign immunity. This Agreement does not waive TOWN rights under a legal theory of sovereign immunity.

5. TIME PERIOD FOR COMPLETION

The TOWN will give the COUNTY a date when the TOWN desires the Project to be completed. However, the COUNTY is under no duty to commence construction at any particular time.

6. THIRD PARTY

This contract shall not be interpreted to inure to the benefit of a third party not a party to this contract. This contract may not be interpreted to waive any statutory or common law defense, immunity, including governmental and sovereign immunity, or any limitation of liability, responsibility, or damage of any party to this contract, party's agent, or party's employee, otherwise provided by law.

7. JOINT VENTURE & AGENCY

The relationship between the parties to this Agreement does not create a partnership or joint venture between the parties. This Agreement does not appoint any party as agent for the other party.

8. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Agreement becomes effective when signed by the last party whose signing makes the Agreement fully executed.

9. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement will automatically terminate on September 30, 2025. Either party may terminate this agreement prior to September 30, 2025 by providing written notice to the other party at least thirty (30) days prior to the intended date of termination. This Agreement may be renewed prior to its expiration upon the mutual consent of the parties in writing.

Executive Summary

This report presents the methodology and study results for a Traffic Signal Warrant Analysis (TSWA) performed by Traf-IQ for the intersection of FM 1886 (Confederate Park Road) at Silver Creek Road in Tarrant County, Texas.

The scope of this study included site visit, analysis of traffic data comprising of 24-hour turning movement counts along each intersection approach during a "typical" weekday (Tuesday through Thursday) when schools were in session, analysis of crash data collected from TxDOT Crash Record Information System (CRIS), and the completion of a TSWA for the intersection of FM 1886 at Silver Creek Road. The analysis was completed in accordance with the procedures and guidelines listed in the 2nd Revision (adopted 2014) to the 2011 *Texas Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices* (TxMUTCD).

Existing lane configuration and current (year 2020) traffic volumes were utilized in the TSWA at the intersection of FM 1886 at Silver Creek Road. Analysis results indicated that the Four-Hour Vehicular Volume – Warrant 2 was satisfied. Based on an evaluation of existing roadway characteristics, current traffic conditions, review of the TSWA results, and engineering judgment, installation of a traffic control signal at the intersection of FM 1886 at Silver Creek Road is recommended. 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Introduction

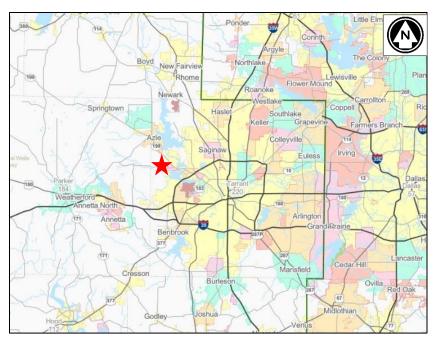


Figure 1. Vicinity Map

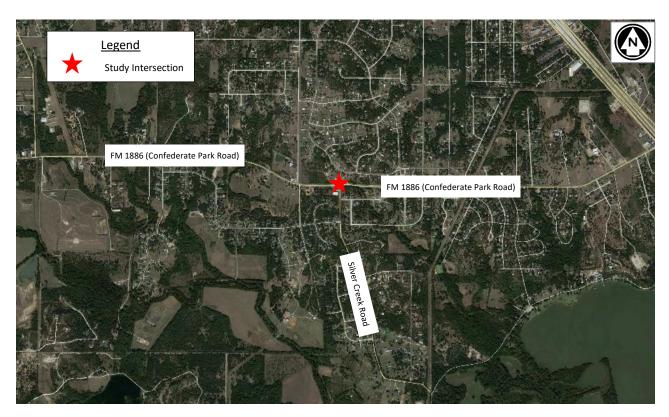


Figure 2. Location Map

This report presents the results of a study performed for a Traffic Signal Warrant Analysis (TSWA) at the intersection of FM 1886 at Silver Creek Road located in Tarrant County, Texas. Vicinity and location maps are shown in Figures 1 and 2, respectively. The study objective was to determine if traffic signal control is justified at the study intersection.

Study Methodology

In order to conduct this study, the following tasks were completed:

- Site visit to observe and document existing traffic conditions at the intersection of FM 1886 at Silver Creek Road,
- Analysis of traffic data comprising of 24-hour turning movement counts along each intersection approach for a "typical" weekday (Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday) when schools were in session,
- Analysis of crash data collected from TxDOT Crash Record Information System (C.R.I.S) for the most recent 36-month period available, and
- Completion of a TSWA for existing conditions at the study intersection in accordance with
 the procedures and guidelines listed in the 2nd Revision (adopted 2014) to the 2011 Texas
 Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (TxMUTCD). Analysis was conducted for the
 existing lane configuration and current (year 2020) traffic volumes.

Existing Conditions

FM 1886 (Confederate Park Road) is an east-west two-lane asphalt roadway with one 12-foot lane in each direction and 5-foot shoulders on both sides of the roadway. The west leg includes a 15-foot two-way left-turn lane (TWLTL). At its intersection with Silver Creek Road, the east leg widens to 40-feet to include a left-turn lane with 130 feet of storage. Pavement markings include centerline, lane line, edge line, arrows, and words and are all in good condition. Pavement surface is in good condition. Drainage is provided by open ditches on both sides of the roadway. The posted speed limit along FM 1886 is 45 mph.

Silver Creek Road is a north-south two-lane asphalt roadway with one 12-foot lane in each direction and no shoulders. Pavement markings include stop bar and centerline markings and are in fair condition. Pavement surface is in good condition. Drainage is provided by open ditches on both sides of the roadway. The posted speed limit along Silver Creek Road is 40 mph.

Silver Creek Road intersects FM 1886 from the south to form a T-intersection. The intersection is a one-way stop-controlled intersection with stop control on the Silver Creek Road approach. There are Intersection Ahead Warning signs (W2-2) on both FM 1886 approaches and there is a STOP AHEAD Warning sign (W3-1) on the Silver Creek approach.

There is a small horizontal curve located along FM 1886 in the study area and the study intersection is located on the western side of the curve. The horizontal alignment along Silver Creek Road is relatively straight within the study area. FM 1886 gently descends vertically from west to east through the intersection. Silver Creek Road descends vertically on its approach to the study intersection but is relatively flat at the intersection.

Land use along the roadways within the study area include small commercial/retail and single-family homes. An existing conditions layout is shown in Appendix A – Exhibit A1.

Data Collection

Data collected for the study intersection included traffic volumes, crash data, intersection geometry data, lane configuration, signage, striping, and photos along each approach to the study intersection.

Traffic Volumes

Traffic data which included 24-hour Turning Movement Counts (TMCs) was collected by C J Hensch & Associates on Thursday, November 5, 2020. TMCs were collected along each approach to the study intersection. The Traffic Volume Data are shown in Appendix B – Table B1.

A review of the traffic data collected shows that FM 1886 had higher 24-hour volumes than Silver Creek Road. Based on the traffic data in conjunction with the roadway classifications, FM 1886 was considered the major roadway for the TSWA. A summary of existing traffic volumes representing the hours containing the eight highest hours for FM 1886 at Silver Creek Road is presented in Table 1.

Site Investigation

A site investigation was conducted on Tuesday, November 3, 2020 to observe current traffic characteristics and to determine existing roadway characteristics specifically roadway geometry, lane widths, speed limits, signing, and pavement markings. Observations made at the intersection during the site investigation revealed no excessive delay, queueing issues, or sight distance issues for vehicles on FM 1886. Slight sight distance issues were found for vehicles stopped on Silver Creek Road looking right due to the horizontal curve. No pedestrians were observed during the site investigations. Photographs of the study intersection are presented in Appendix C.



Crash Data

Crash records for the intersection of FM 1886 at Silver Creek Road were obtained for the most recent 36-month period available. A total of one crash was recorded during this time in the vicinity of the intersection of FM 1886 at Silver Creek Road. The single crash occurred due to failure to yield right of way and resulted in no injury. A collision diagram for this crash is shown in Appendix A – Exhibit A2. A detailed list of the crash recorded at the intersection of FM 1886 at Silver Creek Road is included in Appendix D.

Analysis and Results

A TSWA was conducted for the intersection of FM 1886 at Silver Creek Road for existing conditions in accordance with procedures and guidelines listed in the 2011 TxMUTCD. Within the study area, the posted speed limit along FM 1886 is 45 mph. The 2011 TxMUTCD allows 70 percent of basic vehicular volume warrants requirements to be used if either the posted speed limit or the 85th percentile speed on the major street is greater than 40 mph. Since the posted speed limit on FM 1886 is greater than 40 mph, 70 percent of basic vehicular volume warrant requirements were used to analyze the conditions at the study intersection. The Traffic Survey – Count Analysis Form for the intersection of FM 1886 at Silver Creek Road can be found in Appendix E.

Applicable warrants for this study intersection included the Eight-Hour Vehicular Volume – Warrant 1, Four-Hour Vehicular Volume – Warrant 2, Pedestrian Volume – Warrant 4, and Crash Experience – Warrant 7. The Peak Hour – Warrant 3, School Crossing – Warrant 5, Coordinated Signal System – Warrant 6, Roadway Network – Warrant 8, and Intersection Near a Grade Crossing – Warrant 9 were not applicable to the study intersection based on the study location, existing roadway geometry, and current traffic characteristics. Based on this analysis and existing traffic volumes, the Four-Hour Vehicular Volume – Warrant 2 was satisfied at the intersection of FM 1886 at Silver Creek Road. A summary of the traffic signal warrant analysis at the intersection of FM 1886 at Silver Creek Road is presented in Table 2.

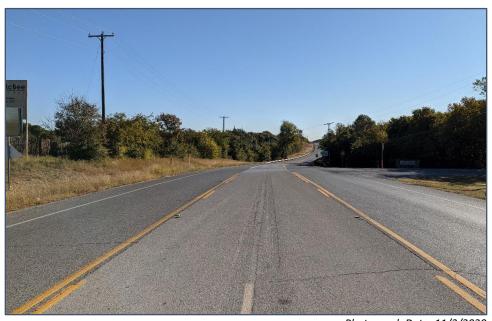

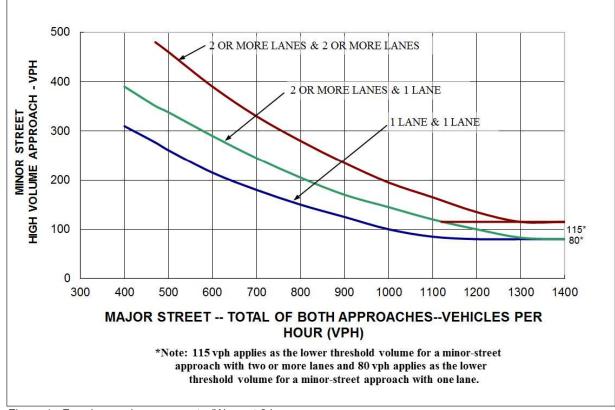


Figure 1. Four-hour volume warrant. (Warrant 2.)

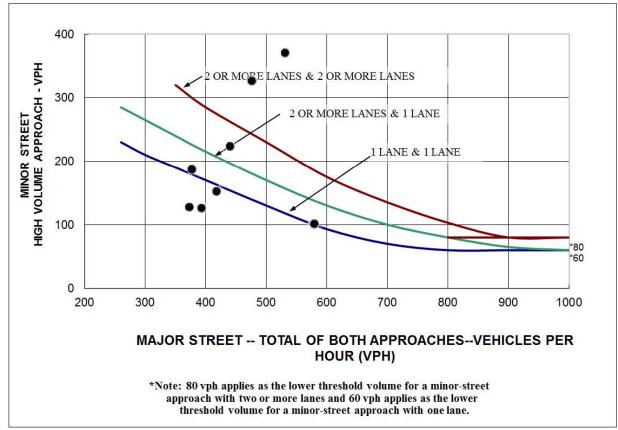
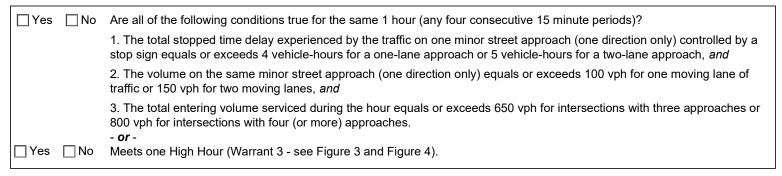


Figure 2. Four-hour volume warrant (70% Factor) (community less than 10,000 population or above 40 MPH on major street). (Warrant 2.)

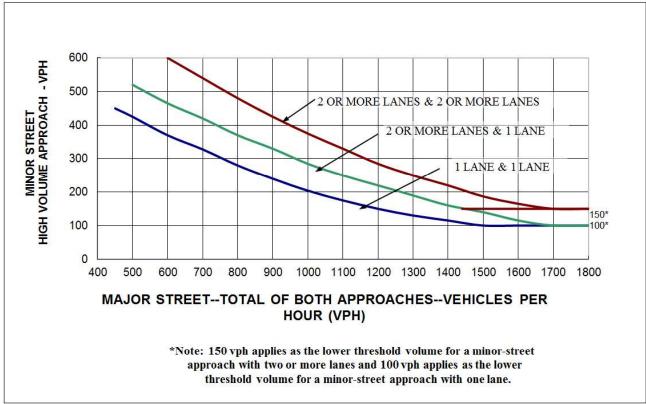


Figure 3. Peak hour volume warrant. (Warrant 3.)

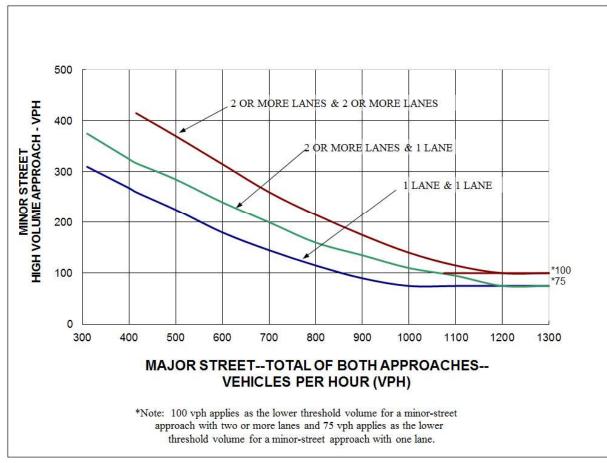


Figure 4. Peak hour volume warrant (70% Factor) (community less than 10,000 population or above 40 MPH on major street). (Warrant 3.)

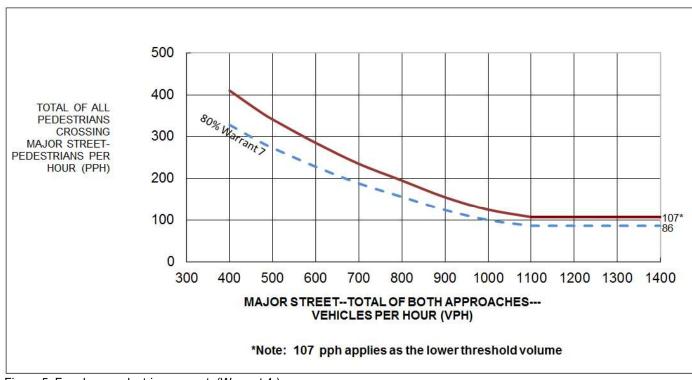


Figure 5. Four hour pedestrian warrant. (Warrant 4.)

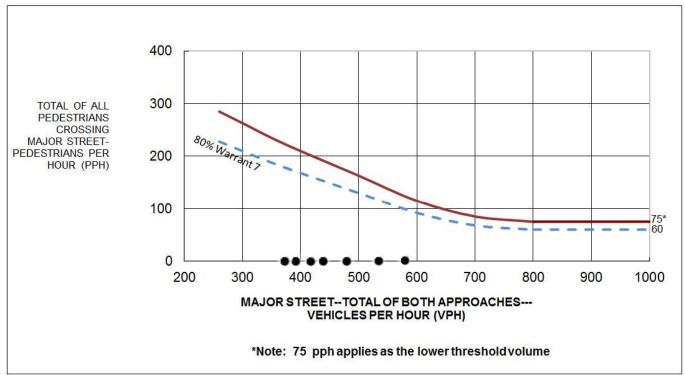


Figure 6. Four hour pedestrian warrant **(70% Factor)**. (community less than 10,000 population or above 35 MPH on major street). (Warrant 4.)

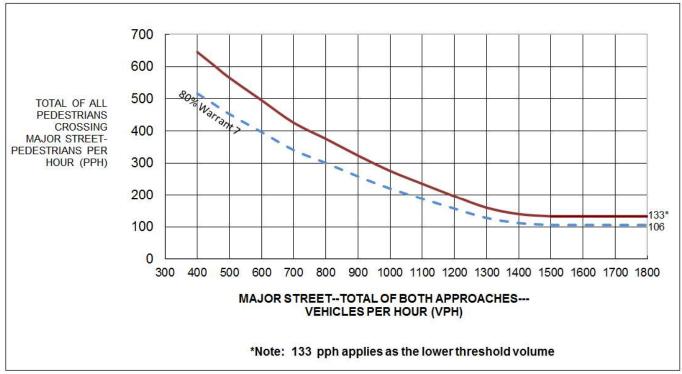


Figure 7. Four hour pedestrian warrant (Warrant 4.)

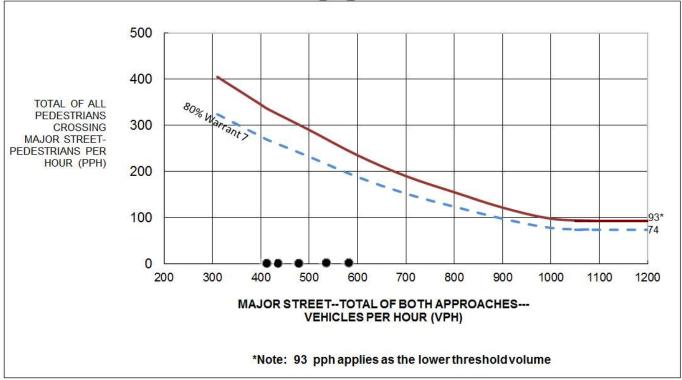


Figure 8. Peak hour pedestrian warrant (70% Factor). (community less than 10,000 population or above 40 MPH on major street). (Warrant 4.)

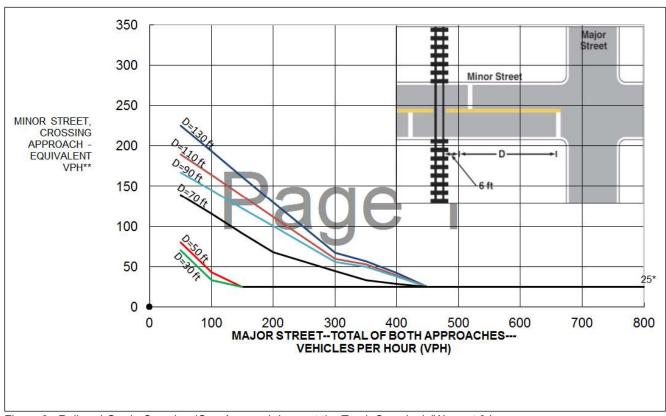


Figure 9. Railroad Grade Crossing (One Approach Lane at the Track Crossing) (Warrant 9.)

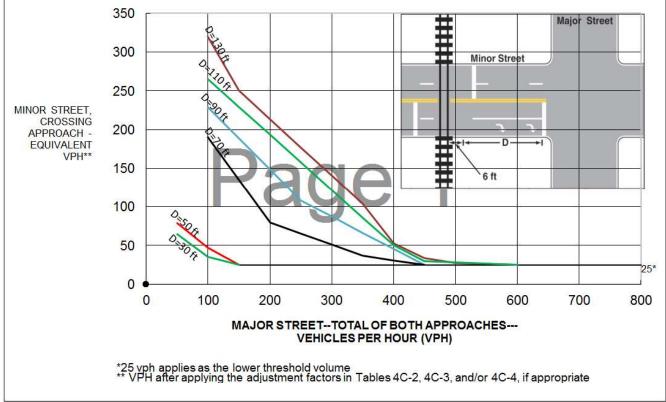


Figure 10. Railroad Grade Crossing (Two or More Approach Lanes at the Track Crossing) (Warrant 9.)
